... that only 14% of the people don't have a muscle in their forearm called Palmaris Longus, yet it doens't effect the performance of the hand at all. You can check if you don't had this muscle by squeezing your hand in a fist and feeling in the centre of the wrist. If you feel 2 tendons you have it. If you only have 1 tendon you probably don't have it. Make sure to check both wrists.
