

After that, I moved to Bristol to be a laboratory technician before taking a PhD studying metastasis in human melanoma. All followed by a postdoc in biochemical engineering at UC Santa Barbara (California) and then in neuroblastoma immunotherapy at the University of Southampton (UoS). In the meantime, I gradually started gaining experience in research engagement, until I moved completely career path to "the other side of the bench" and today I work for the Public Engagement with Research unit (PERu), where I am in charge of planning, organising and delivering the Southampton Science and Engineering Festival (SOTSEF), the Human Worlds Festival and the itinerant 'Bringing Research to Life' Roadshow.
